
Derry, N. Ireland. 2005 - Present

Art Arcadia was set up through the collaborative willpower of 4 creative individuals to provide residency opportunities for artists of all disciplines at differing stages of their career.

Art Arcadia seeks out funding opportunities and binds together funders/organisations to collectively deliver a cost effective and sustainable programme of

residencies tailored to a specific locale. To date Art Arcadia has initiated 7 residencies, pooling the resources of 9 organisations to help 26 artists develop their career in an international setting, with more residencies planned in 2016. Art Arcadia is made up of Paola Bernardelli, Kieran Ferris, Eithne Gfeller and Theo Sims.














Homecoming: Part II














Paola Bernardelli Treasurer

Paola Bernardelli is an Italian lens based artist living in Derry; her practice focuses on the exploration of perceived trivial or outright uncomfortable narratives that slip through the fabric of history, at the same time attempting to enquire into photography's identity within the constant overflow of images characteristic of our contemporary world.

Alongside her art practice, she has a background in professional photography specialising in art documentation. Additionally, over the past decade, she has accumulated a substantial experience in working with contemporary art galleries in the areas of exhibition set up, archiving and invigilation. She has developed, planned and coordinated a series of international art and educational projects in collaboration with local and international art organisations, encouraging and facilitating the mobility of artists and art students wishing to enrich their practice and further their careers.

Eithne Gfeller is a registered art psychotherapist and artist facilitator working with diverse communities in Northern Ireland. Her work includes the facilitation, curation and installation of community based exhibitions involving some of the most marginalised people in Northern Ireland. She currently works with statutory, charitable, and voluntary organisations using art and creativity to promote well-being.

Her personal art practice is process based, an examination of the liminal space of the loss experience. Her work is usually produced as a response to the experience of being with people who live with severe losses combined with personal experience.

She was the owner /artist/maker of an arts and crafts business for ten years +, trading mostly in the UK and Ireland. She has lived and travelled extensively in the U.S. Australia and South East Asia.

Contemporary crafts and Interactive Media, currently employed with the Brian Clarke Studio, London. For the previous 10 years he worked as exhibition coordinator at Void Gallery, Derry, installing the works of 65+ highprofile artists including Mark Wallinger, Santiago Sierra, Ackroyd & Harvey, Bill Drummond and Mat Collishaw. Ferris has also taken part in many non-gallery endeavors, for example as a member of the artistic group Null who dismantled and moved 'Tinnevs' a functioning bar as part of the project call Molly Aida. Prior to this he was an academic researcher at the University of Limerick, Ireland, specialised in the design and use of novel technology within museums, and has published his work at both ACM SIGCHI Designing Interactive Systems (DIS) 2002 and 2004 plus a number of other international academic conferences. A builder of timber framed houses/cabins, Ferris is an accomplished craftsperson and continues to specialise as an art technician/archivist.

Theo Sims is a visual artist whose installations often focus on the juxtaposition of the familiar and everyday with some form of contextual subversion or perversion. His sharp sense of humor is often fused with the social, ephemeral and personal. Sims has presented his installations across Canada in Toronto, St. Johns, Winnipeg, Vancouver and Calgary and has presented in several solo and group exhibitions in Northern Ireland, the Republic of Ireland and across Europe.

His work has been reviewed or featured in Canadian Art, Abridged, C Magazine, Circa, The Irish Times, The Sunday Times, The Globe & Mail, Border Crossings, BlackFlash, The New York Times and Maclean's Magazine. Theo Sims has also worn the hat of programmer / curator and was formerly the Director of the Context Gallery in Derry, Programming Director of Ace Art inc. in Winnipeg and Co-Managing Editor of BlackFlash Magazine in Saskatoon.

His most recent curatorial experiment, The Lewyc Institute of Contemporary Art (LICA) is an experimental space specialising in context and site-specific works by Canadian and international artists, produced in (and occasionally on) his home in Winnipeg.
